

# Rainy week delays work on Beulah Dam

The rainy weather last week kept the work at the Lake Beulah Dam project site to a minimum for the beginning of the week, according to the Walworth County Department of Public Works.

Crews started back working on Friday to install the permanent sheet pile along the south side of Highway J west of the existing spillway structure.

The asphalt roadway was removed in the area over the existing structure and westerly where the temporary diversion channel will be dug.

According to the DPW, work planned for this coming week includes the contractor finishing up the section of permanent sheet piling on the south side, west of the spillway structure; then focusing on driving temporary H-piles that will have wood and steel installed between them for the diversion channel just west of the existing

spillway structure.

Officials from the DPW, anticipate the diversion channel will be in-place this coming week, with the potential of the old spillway being removed later in the week.

Work will still be concentrated at the Marsh Road and Highway J intersection with a great deal of activity going on during working hours.

Vibration monitoring activities are on-going and the DPW is awaiting the results of the initial seismograph readings as well as the readings taken during construction activities that have induced vibrations.

Most of the revised signage for the detour route has been installed and the few remaining signs should be taken care of this week.

# Mukwonago Clean Sweep May 16

## Open to Walworth County residents

Waukesha and Walworth Counties are co-sponsoring a one-day collection of household hazardous waste in Mukwonago on Saturday, May 16. Residents may drop off waste items free-of-charge from 8 a.m. to Noon at the Village Public Works Garage located at 630 Highway NN.

The annual Clean Sweep event in Mukwonago is always open to Waukesha County residents. This is the sixth time household resi-

dents in Walworth County will have the opportunity to participate.

An intergovernmental arrangement between the two counties has helped to provide cost-effective and convenient services to the residents in this area, while protecting public health and the environment. Each county pays for services provided to its respective residents so all participants need to provide proof of residency.

Clean Sweep helps household residents properly dispose of banned, damaged, unusable or unwanted waste products that contain corrosive, toxic, ignitable or reactive ingredients. Products with a "warning" label on the container generally fit the bill and include things like pesticides, herbicides, old fuel, degreaser, oil-based paint, varnish, paint remover and mercury-containing products like fluorescent bulbs and old

thermometers.

The following items will not be collected at this event: Latex paint, non-hazardous cleaning products, sharps, medicines and electronics.
