Beulah dam project on schedule

The new culvert has been installed at the Lake Beulah dam spillway, according to a press release from Kevin Brunner, director of Central Services with the Walworth County Department of Public Works.

Work on finishing the permanent sheet pile wall and metal cap will be wrapping up while the concrete work continues along the south side of the new structure.

"Work is progressing nicely and the site will continue to be very busy this week with deliveries of more materials and equipment," Brunner stated.

Concrete work to get the inlet structure constructed will be the main focus. Once the new inlet structure is installed and a significant amount of concrete work is completed the water will then be diverted to flow through the new spillway culvert structure, Brunner stated.

Lake levels have been continuously monitored and have risen about 3 inches from the beginning of construction. With all the rain lately, the increase in lake level was expected.

"We will continue to monitor the lake level and if the increase in lake level keeps occurring additional measures will be taken to assure that the lake level keeps occurring, additional measures will be taken to assure that the lake level is in compliance with the inspection, operation and maintenance plan," Brunner stated.
